WHERE TO START

LEARNING ZONES

Whistler Blackcomb has ideal learning terrain. No matter what lift you take up, there's an easy route down.

- Olympic Learning Area (Whistler Mountain)** Midway up the Whistler Village Gondola. Slow-skiing Beginners' Zone, easy-loading Olympic Chair and Magic Carpets.
- Magic Chair Area (Blackcomb Mountain)** Easy-loading triple chair and Magic Carpets, both next to the handy Rentals and Daylodge Services at the base of Blackcomb Mountain.
- What's Next?** Once you've got your legs under you, here are just a few ways to explore a bit more of our two mountains.
 - Slow Zones** See yellow highlighted areas on map where the areas are monitored for your safety.
 - Emerald Zone, Whistler Mountain:** A stunning playground of easy and intermediate runs, the Emerald Zone is perfect for all skill levels. Accessed from the top of the Whistler Village Gondola and Emerald 6 Express, this area offers wide-open trails with beautiful alpine views. We recommend starting on **Whiskey Jack** or cruising down **Ego Bowl**—perfect for warm-up runs and building confidence.
 - Catskinner Zone, Blackcomb Mountain:** Discover Blackcomb's friendliest terrain where gentle runs. Accessible from the Blackcomb Gondola and Catskinner Express, this zone is ideal for beginners and those looking for relaxed cruising. Begin your journey on **Easy Out**, then transition to **Over Easy** for an enjoyable ride down.

FAMILIES

Outdoor playlands: The Magic Castle on Blackcomb and the Tree Fort on Whistler are must-visit spots for families with young adventurers. Kick off your skis or boards and explore these outdoor playlands—both completely free and packed with fun!

- ▶ The Magic Castle, nestled in Blackcomb's Children's Adventure Park, is easily accessible via Easy Out and Over Easy, in the Catskinner zone
- ▶ The Tree Fort is perched on Whistler Mountain, just off the Bear Cub trail near the Big Red Express chairlift.

Enchanted Forest Adventure Trail winds through Whistler's old-growth forest in the Emerald Zone. This fun, curvy trail lets young adventurers explore towering trees and hidden paths. With gentle turns and a hint of mystery, it's the perfect spot for kids and families to enjoy Whistler's natural magic!

Sea to Sky Railway Adventure Trail on Blackcomb Mountain is a delightful, railway-themed trail designed for kids and families. This fun route mirrors the twists and turns of a classic train journey, with smooth descents and charming railway artifacts adding to the adventure. Ideal for young skiers and riders,

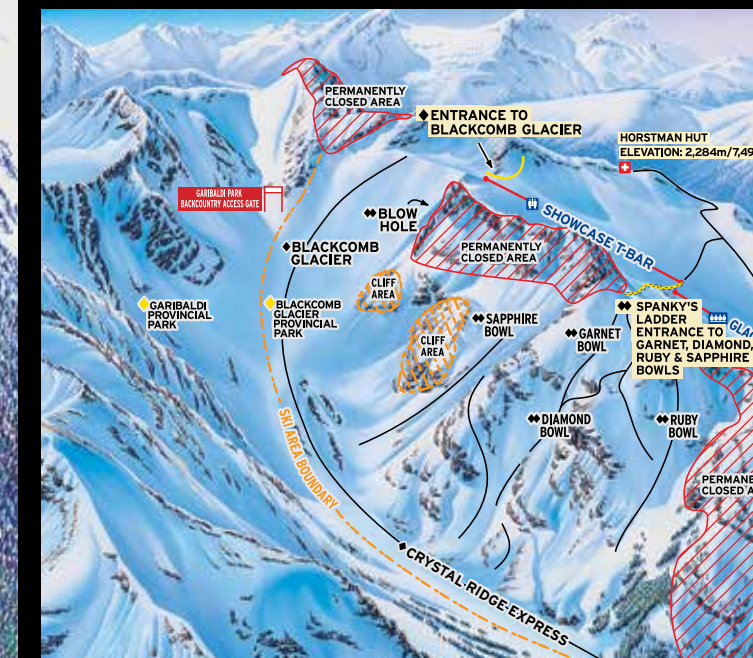

Blackcomb Glacier

Enter from the top of the Showcase T-Bar, or experts can use the Spanky's Ladder entrance, accessed from the top of the Glacier Express. Designated runs in this area are located within Blackcomb Glacier Provincial Park and are managed under a Park Use Permit for the purposes of snow and avalanche control. Closures will be in effect when avalanche danger exists and blasting may be in progress.

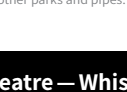

TERRAIN PARKS

Pre-ride, Re-ride, Freeride.

Prior to using Freestyle Terrain, you are responsible for familiarizing yourself with park features and etiquette. Obey all instructions, warnings and signs. Freestyle skills require maintaining control on the ground and in the air. Use of Freestyle Terrain exposes you to the risk of serious injury or death. Inverted aerials are not recommended. You assume the risk.

*Helmets are mandatory in the Highest Level Terrain Park and recommended in all other parks and pipes.



SAFETY

Know It, Respect It, Ride It.

- ▶ If you see an accident on the hill that requires first aid: make a cross with skis or lay a snowboard above the site. Report the location and type of injury to the nearest ski area employee.
- ▶ Whistler Blackcomb recommends **helmet usage** for skiing or riding.
- ▶ Watch for changing conditions—natural or man-made.
- ▶ Vehicles may be encountered on Whistler Blackcomb Mountains. Please slow down and give them a wide berth.
- ▶ Irresponsible, reckless, or discourteous skiing and riding on any part of the mountain may result in loss of lift access privileges.
- ▶ **Caution** snow immersion suffocation from deep snow or tree wells can be fatal. Always ride with a partner. Visit deepsnowsafety.org
- ▶ Difficulty ratings are relative to each ski area. Skiers and riders should work their way up starting with the easiest run, regardless of their ability level.
- ▶ Signage and fencing are used to inform you of the presence of a potential obstacle or hazard. Be aware that some hazards are not marked, use caution at all times.

BACKCOUNTRY AND BC PARKS

Garibaldi Provincial Park

The area beyond the ski area boundary is neither controlled nor patrolled by the ski patrol. Some ski areas permit skiers and snowboarders to travel beyond the ski area boundary into the backcountry. Backcountry travel can be very hazardous and requires specialized equipment, training and experience. Do not travel into the backcountry if you are not qualified to do so.

For guests looking to explore the backcountry accessible from Whistler Blackcomb there are a number of resources available to boost your safety knowledge and awareness.

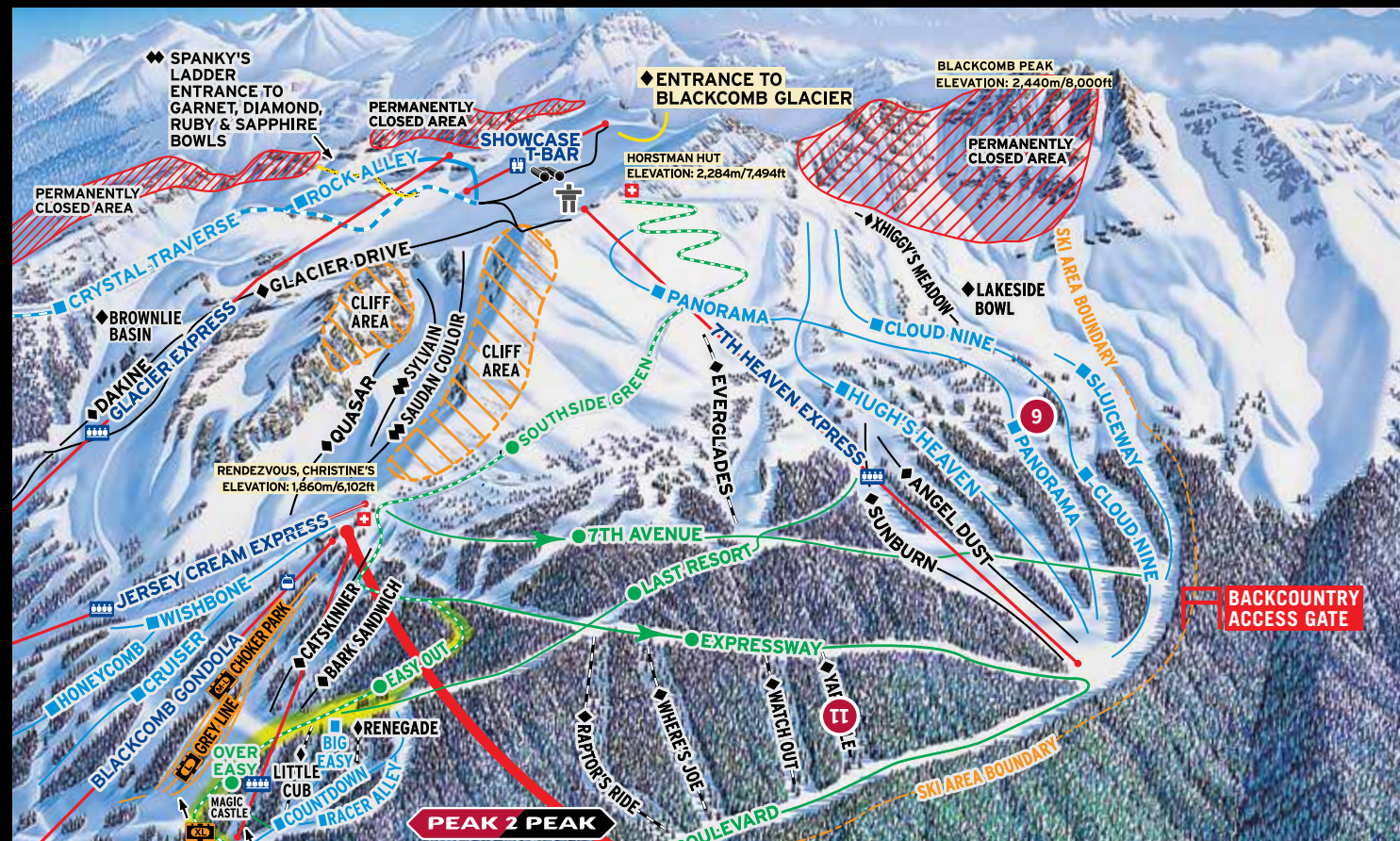

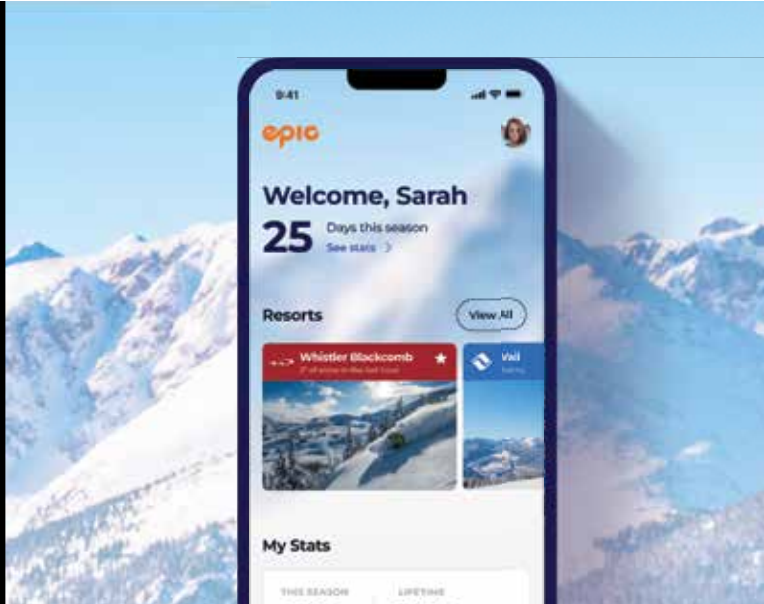
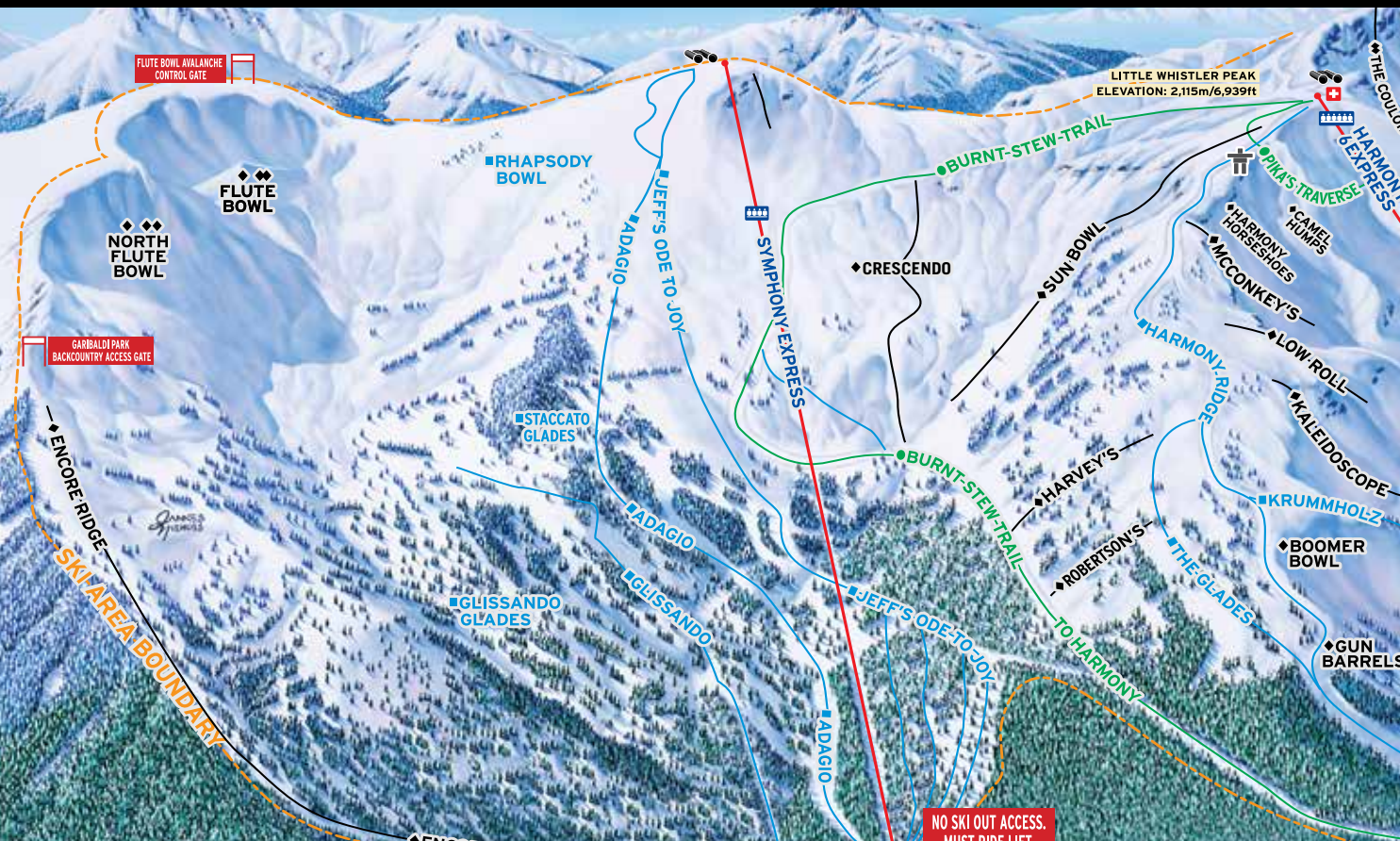
7th Heaven—Blackcomb Mountain

When the sun is shining, slap on the sunscreen and head for Heaven. Take skiers' left for panoramic cruising and amazing across-the-valley views of Whistler Mountain. To return to the Rendezvous, stay to skiers' right on Green Line.



Symphony Amphitheatre—Whistler Mountain

Access to Flute Bowl from the Symphony Express, Harmony 6 Express or Peak Express chairs. Visibility and conditions in Flute Bowl can change rapidly. When in doubt, follow piste trail markers. Please follow all posted signs for boundary notification.

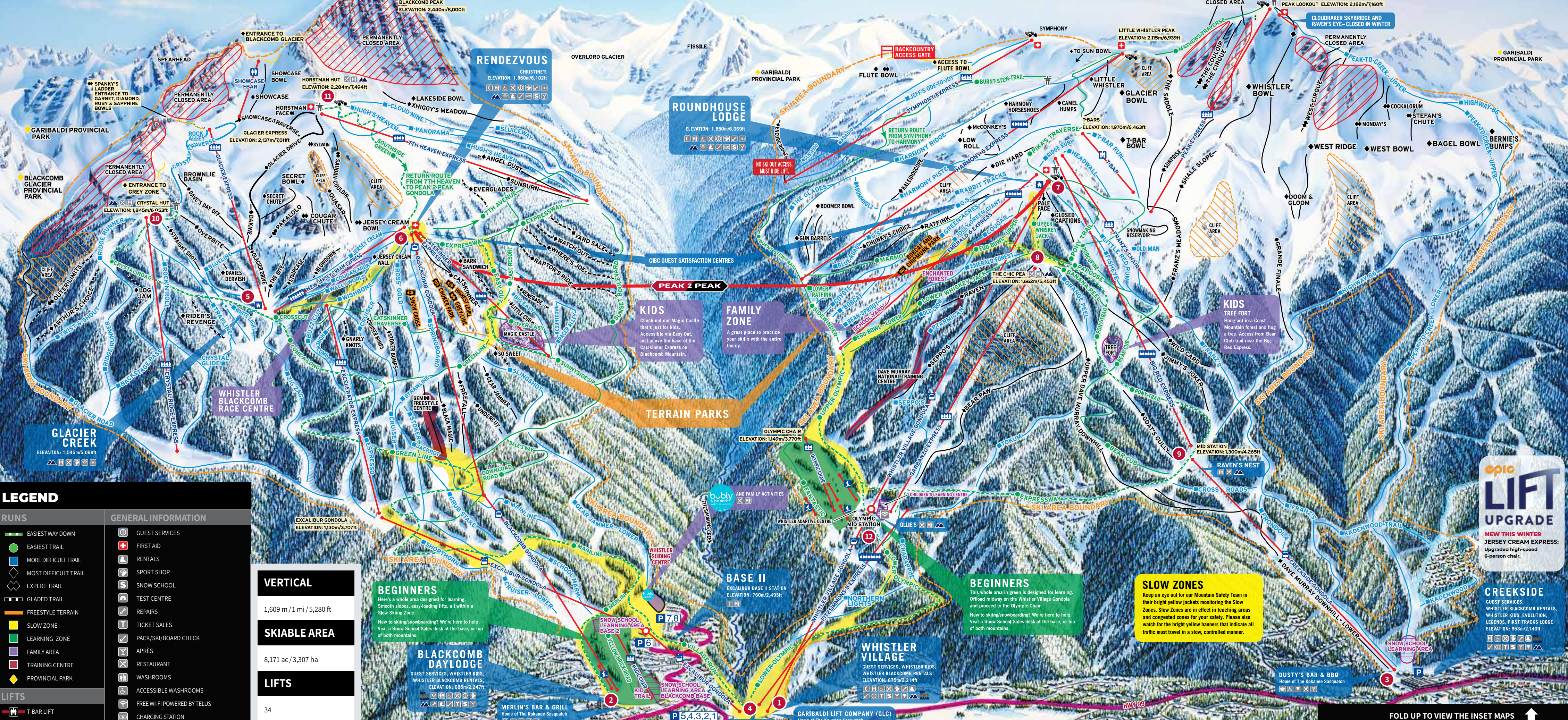

SLOW ZONES

Keep an eye out for our Mountain Safety Team in their bright yellow jackets, monitoring the Slow Zones. Slow zones are in effect in teaching areas and congested zones for your safety. Please also watch for the bright yellow banners that indicate all traffic must travel in a slow, controlled manner.

CREEKSIDE

THESE ARE ELEMENTS OF RISK THAT COMMON SENSE AND PERSONAL AWARENESS CAN HELP REDUCE. ALWAYS SHOW COURTESY TO OTHERS. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE CODE LISTED BELOW AND SHARE WITH OTHERS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR A SAFE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.

- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid people or objects.
- People ahead or downhill of you have the right-of-way. You must avoid them.
- Stop only when you are visible from above and do not restrict traffic.
- Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail.
- You must prevent runaway equipment.
- Read and obey all signs, warnings and hazard markings.
- Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- You must know how and be able to load, ride and unload lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant.
- Do not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- If you are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact information with each other and a ski area employee.

Know the code - It is your responsibility.
